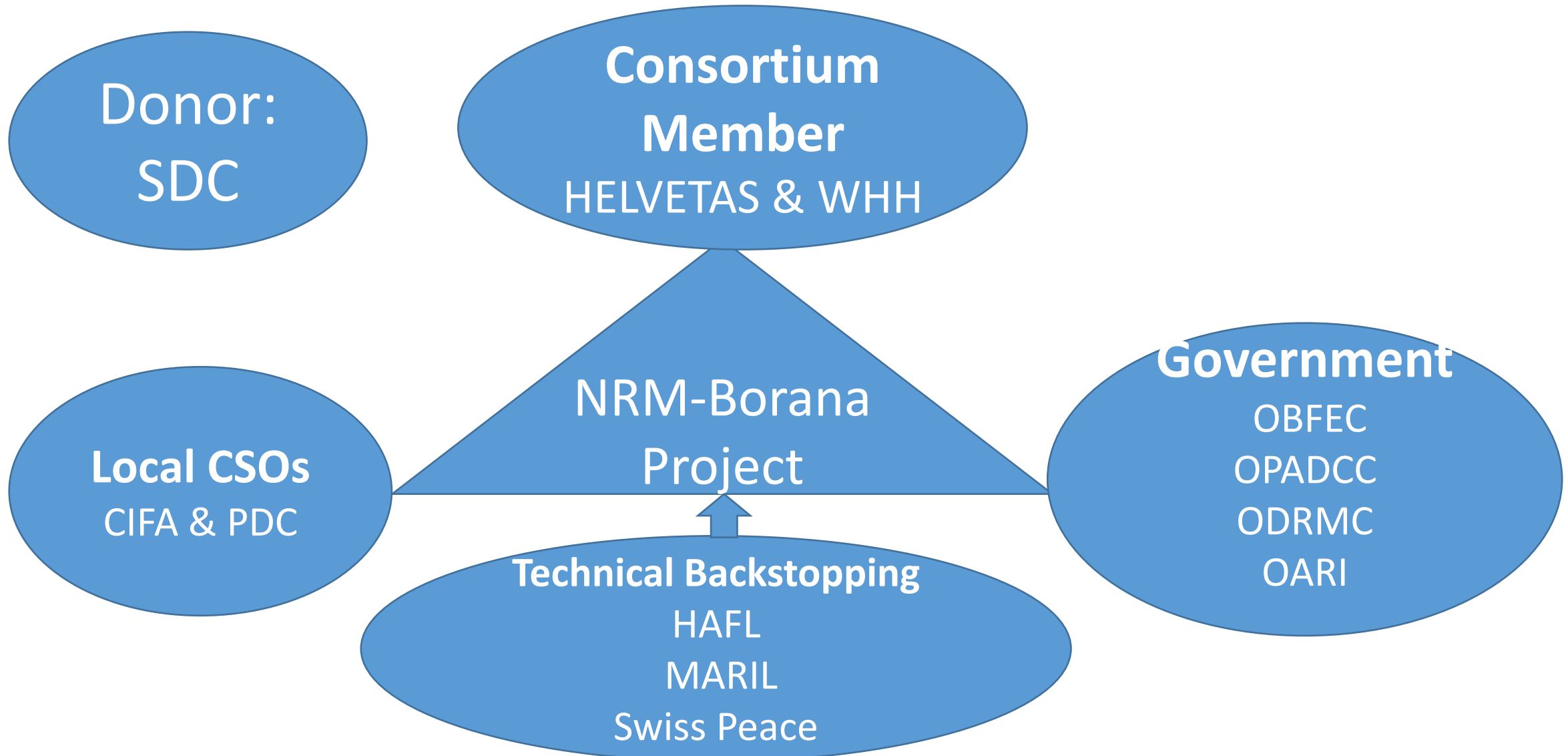

- Vision mapping by the community (where they want to reach)
- Identifying required action and actors
- Resources required ( internal & external)
- Beneficiaries: Pastoralists and Agro-pastoralists
- around 12'150 households
- With 70'000 direct beneficiaries
