Duration:

› 2017-2022

Objective:

- › Conservation and more productive use of water, soil and pastureland
- › Strengthened drought resilience

Investments:

- Rehabilitation of agricultural irrigation systems
- Water storage systems (e.g. sand dams)
- Prosopis management
- Rehabilitation, soil cultivation and conservation measures for pasture areas

Areas of work:

- Selected Woredas in Afar and Somali.



Link to the overall development framework

- ▶ rehabilitate farmland enabling the local population to manage and use their natural resources
- ▶ strengthen the production systems of pastoralists and agro-pastoralists, to diversify their livelihoods and to enhance drought resilience
- ▶ adopting internationally proven technologies for Prosopis clearing and rangeland management
- ▶ the programme is inter-linked to the overall development framework and road map for the Region and the Country (such as GTP, Pastoralist Development Policy and IGAD Strategies)

Cooperation with different partners



- ▶ Main partner: Ministry of Agriculture and Regional Bureau of Pastoral and Agricultural Development (BoPAD) - supported by Implementation Consultants a) GITEC and b) GOPA
- ▶ Communities: Using a highly participatory approach to reach Free and Prior Informed Consent (FPIC)
- ▶ Cooperation between the programme and the main governmental institutions is well organized (e.g. Steering Committees)
- ▶ The programme supports intensively cooperation with other organizations (for contracts with NGOs, academic institutions)

Strengthening cooperation and networking

- ▶ Cooperation with other actors is mainly responsibility of MoA. Financial cooperation supports, e.g. through financing Implementation Consultants
- ▶ Cooperation with other Donors is important, esp. with GIZ, WB, IFAD, AfDB. On local level, it depends mainly on personal aspects and contacts. On national level, main challenge is time restrictions of responsible persons and lack of delegation from responsible key persons to other staff members.
