Lowland Interventions Activities

To improve the food and nutrition security and resilience of (agro) pastoralist communities in the Borana zone 1. Pastoralists have increased access to pasture and water resources from rehabilitated and / or improved rangeland.

2. Pastoralist women incomes are increased while women diversify their livelihoods.

3. Natural resource management interventions are better coordinated, harmonised, and knowledge management is improved to properly document and scaleup promising practices.

4. Local governments and customary institutions collaborate to exercise accountable and inclusive governance and provide effective services related to natural resource management and conflict prevention. Sustainable Resource Management




- Participatory Rangeland Mapping (PRM) as entry point
